

CEC Household Support Fund – funding for community food / other projects across Cheshire East



Austin and Hope Pilkington Trust Grant (Food Poverty) - focus on enabling resilience and independence e.g. food education & cooking skills – July 31



Following up the discussions from last Food Alliance meeting e.g. referral pathways & surplus food solution (reframing the Right to Food strategy)



Rural Food Insecurity Network themes - food supply & distribution, models of community food provision & providing access to wraparound support



Continuing to work with CEC and C&M NHS to increase Healthy Start uptake



Alignment with Cheshire East Eat Well, Move More Partnership work



Introduce more low-cost, sustainable food pathways e.g. social supermarkets / Community shop / food pantries



Sector Collaboration


Voluntary & Food Social Education Faith Groups Housing Community Industry Innovation Digital & Local Health Transport Environment Businesses Government Media
